

## Collaborations

The Nightingale is in continuous collaborations with the following partners, largely through the auspices of resident company [Prodigal Theatre](#).

### [Dah Teatar](#)

Dah have twice visited the venue as part of the international Masters Season and will return again for the 2008 Masters programme. Based in Belgrade, Serbia, Dah are a laboratory theatre company working in the Odin Tradition. They have their own venue through which they support the development of artists in Belgrade, and present international companies and artists. Dah have won several international awards for the political nature of their work.

### [Teatro Della Contraddizione](#)

TDC are another performing company who run their own venue, situated in Milan, Italy. They ran a workshop residency at the Nightingale during the 2007 Masters Season. At their venue TDC run a school training actors and directors in their techniques, and stage an annual season of experimental theatre from across Europe at which Prodigal has performed for the last three years.

### [New Writing South](#)

Is a new writing organisation in the South East open to all creative writers, for those seeking creative writers and for other creative writing agencies including all producers of dramatic writing. NWS aims to identify and nurture talent, encourage creative development and offer resources to playwrights and other creative writers in the UK's South East region. The Nightingale is an associate venue.

### [Movement 12](#)

Movement 12 is a group of independent dance artists based in and around Brighton who curates an international programme of artist - led professional development opportunities for dance artists. The programme includes regular classes with nationally and internationally renowned teachers; workshops and summer schools; space to try out ideas and show work in progress; and opportunities to meet, discuss and explore. Much of their work is hosted at the Nightingale who supports the organisation.

### [Brighton Festival & Fringe](#)

The Nightingale continues to host work from both programmes during the May Festival. It was the first venue to win the "Spirit of the Fringe Award" and is respected as the year round home of Brighton's Fringe performance.
